

Our Commander's Message

Hello Fellow Squadron Members,

Good news! The Winter Soltis has passed and daylight hours are getting longer! After a fun WSPS

Christmas Social, we are looking forward to being together at Squadron gatherings in coming months!

The annual summer Cruise Committee met in December at Donna and Bill Zimmerman's for a productive planning session! Additionally, we welcomed new members John and Colleen Schleicher to our boating club!

Hopefully you had a chance to review the important email sent out to Squadron members in November. To recap, because of the decline in membership and challenges in recruiting new members, a market study was completed by ABC. The results, not surprising, found that USPS, who has been doing business the same way for 100 years, was viewed as being stogy and out of touch. Times have changed. Today's boaters are more diverse, with different interests and less time devoted to boating activities. Families are busier. Technology has changed entertainment and learning, with introductory boating courses found for free on the internet. The economic downturn a few years ago has had a lasting impact, and traditional baby-boomer boaters are aging out. Many boaters have not heard of the United States Power Squadrons or they get us mixed up with other organi-

One of the recommendations implemented was to change the name to something people interested in boating could easily identify. USPS adopted the name USPS "doing business as" America's Boating Club about two years ago. The name upgrade from USPS to America's Boating Club has been reflected in our Lubber's Line Newsletter

In order to be consistent with branding, ABC is asking all squadrons to incorporate America's Boating Club into their name., i.e., WSPS, doing business as America's Club - Wilmington. Within the past year, over 30% of the squadrons in our District of 31 squadrons have added to their name, i.e., America's Boating Club - Annapolis, and America's Boating Club - Baltimore, formerly Dundalk Power Squadron. Other Squadrons in our District are in discussion/process regarding a "doing business as" name addition. This has been under discussion with our WSPS Executive Committee. No decision has been made to add to our name; however, if we were to add to our name – what would best reflect who we are? America's Boating Club – Wilmington is one option, but given that most of the members in our Squadron do not and would not boat out of the port of Wilmington, suggestions are welcome!

District Commander's Conference calls occur monthly. and I will keep you up to date.

Please let me know if you have any thoughts about this, and if you support and/or have suggestions for a name change. I appreciate the handful of responses I have received, two with suggested name changes, ABC – Delaware, which is already taken by the Delaware River Squadron, and. ABC Upper Chesapeake Bay. This is your squadron, your boating club! We want to reflect your thoughts in any decisions made. I am looking forward to seeing each of you at our monthly WSPS Socials!







Executive Officer's Report





This year the D/5 fall conference was held in Fredericksburg Virginia. The fall conference traditionally focuses on the educational programs ongoing across the district. Primarily, because of the influence of technology, there are always important updates to the programs and to how program logistics and reporting are carried out.

For those who have not paying close attention, the Seamanship course is now titled Boat Handling. After completing the course which can be done as six separate seminars, the student is referred to as an Inland Navigator and has the letter S listed as their grade designator. Piloting has become Coastal Navigation, Advanced Piloting has become Advanced Coastal Navigation, Junior Navigation has become Offshore Navigation and Navigation has become Celestial Navigation. Celestial Navigator plus five electives earns members the title of Senior Navigator. If you would like to chase the wintertime blues away by taking a member course or a seminar, get in touch with Dave Benfer, our squadron SEO.

In addition to educational reports and awards, there was much discussion of the National Governing Board Meeting that was held last October in Louisville Kentucky. Walter Neese, our District Commander, not only covered the summary, but also the emotion that surrounded many of the controversial ideas discussed there. As one might expect, Wilmington Sail and Power Squadron is one or perhaps two steps ahead of many other squadrons in adopting the popular ideas that have a clear relation to member retention and to attracting new members. It is clear that across the nation all of the most successful squadrons have a clear understanding of their member's wants and needs, and are finding many good ways to use the increased discretion offered by the National Bridge.

If you are aware of a want or need in the squadron that is going unfulfilled, or know of a way to help members grow in knowledge or confidence, do not hesitate to contact a bridge member with your idea. If you help, we can continue to remain at the front of the fleet.

Boat Education Mandates are Coming

Education, the need and value of mandatory boating education specifically, is apparently gaining some quiet traction in some of the state legislatures across the country.

The incidences of boating related fatalities continue to rise across many parts of our nation. Delaware requires any boat operator born after January 1, 1978 to have an operator's certificate. These regulations have been around for many years and were set in place to create an increased level of on



-water knowledge and safety awareness on the part of the boating public. Most states have some form of mandatory boating education laws. Has it helped? The frequency and severity of water-related accidents continues to be an ongoing problem, but education certainly hasn't hurt. Age phasing may take a decade or more with the final objective being - mandatory education for all boaters regardless of age and/or experience.

WSPS is still in the boating education business. Our next certification course is scheduled for April 18, 2020. Location - Delaware Safety Council offices.

Speaking of safety, at the December Holiday Social P/C Mark Atkinson made attending members

Boating Safety News

Is it Safe to Swim in the Chesapeake Bay?

After rainfall of 1/2 inch or more, all Anne Arundel County beaches are under a no swimming/no direct water contact advisory for at least 48 hours.

Do not swim in the Bay before checking this site: Anne Arundel County's Beach Swimming Guide; https://aahealth.org/beach-swimming-guide/Never swim in cloudy, murky water or if the water has an odd appearance—greener or browner than usual.

Look for trash and other signs of pollution, such as oil slicks or scum on the water.

Do not swim in the Bay if you have an ear infection, a perforated ear-

drum, open cuts, scratches or skin lesions, or a compromised immune system.

Do not swim in water areas where there is a fish kill or where there are any dead animals or known algae bloom.

Try not to swallow water while swimming. When water contact cannot be avoided:

Cover wounds with water proof bandages.

Carry hand sanitizer to swimming areas and when fishing or crabbing so that wounds that occur can be cleansed immediately or have ready access to soap and water.

Wear water shoes to avoid cuts and scrapes.

Always shower following swimming in natural waters and wash hands before handling food or eating.

If you follow these simple rules, you will lower your risk for getting a water-related disease dramatically.

"Which Areas of the Chesapeake are Safest?"

Unfortunately, there is not a single area that is "always safe". The possibility of sewage leak, or irresponsible boater pumping out, means that any river can suddenly develop high bacterial counts. Local health departments test for bacteria from human feces (usually E. coli or Enterococci) once or twice per week. In Annapolis and surrounding areas, these results can be easily found on Anne Arundel Health Department's website: Water Quality Report. These tests are performed by local health departments following guidelines set up by the EPA. The EPA's "acceptable" level of fecal bacteria is 104 or fewer bacteria colonies per 100 milliliters of water. If you are not checking this report, you would have no idea which beaches are near closure. Please note: the Water Quality Monitoring Program does NOT sample in the 48 hours after rainfall of 1/2 inch or more.

2020 Summer Cruise



On a chilly day in mid-December, members of the WSPS Cruise Committee gathered to plan for our annual summer Cruise. Donna, Cruise Co-Chair, and Bill Zimmerman hosted in their lovely home decorated for the holidays!

First and foremost, the decision to **move the start of the cruise up a week** was approved by the Committee. **The WSPS Annual Cruise is scheduled for Saturday, June 6 to Friday, June 12, 2020**. We briefly reviewed options for a northern bay cruise, noted limited opportunities, then headed south. Our KIA's (Know It All's) are actively checking on availability of marinas, catering and dining options. The Registration Fee will be increased to \$50. It hasn't changed for many years! The tentative schedule is:

Commander's Kick-off scheduled for North Point Marina, will be catered. Price will increase from \$10 to \$15.

Safe Harbor Marina, Oxford (formerly Mear's) - An activity will be planned. Dinner on your own. Trippe Creek, Choptank River – We will have assigned raft-ups as we do traditionally on Sunday. Boaters can decide on their own if they prefer a shared meal.

Cambridge Municipal Yacht Basin – Dinner and Awards banquet.

Sail Rallyes – There may be a rally on Sunday. Bill Z. will work his magic for the rallyes during the week. **The Cruise Book** – will once again be prepared by Barbara Sharpless, with input from all Cruise Committee members.

Registration forms should be available by the end of January. Initial registration fees are due in by March 31 with final payment due by April 30, 2020.


Assemblies Committee
