P/C Bill O. Moody, AP



P/C Bill O. Moody, AP, age 92, passed on November 11, 2022 in his residence at Maris Grove in Glen Mills, Pa. Bill's involvement with United States Power Squadrons dates back to 1975 when he and wife Carol joined Wilmington Power Squadron (WPS), now America's Boating Club Wilmington. The family was active, participating in most of the varied boating related activities sponsored by WPS. In post-boating years, he could be readily prompted into sharing some interesting tales relating to the family's "life and times" aboard the family trawler, "Tuffy", on the Chesapeake.

In 1986-1987, he became the Commander of WPS. Bill, by virtue of his year after year of squadron involvement, became quite knowledgeable of our National Organization, the District 5 functions, and, of course, the people and workings of WPS. His sage inputs were, at certain junctions of our history, invaluable. Bill earned 32 Merit Marks and was awarded a Life Membership for his years of participation and the Educational Proficiency Award. His wife Carol supported him, his involvement, and all things WPS throughout his 47-year voyage.

50th Anniversary of Hurricane Agnes, January 6, 2023 on Zoom

ABC-Wilmington is looking forward to our January speaker, author Gary Letcher. Please join us on **Friday, January 6, 2023**, via Zoom. The **social will begin at 6:30 pm** and the presentation at 7 pm.

June 2022 marked the 50th anniversary of Hurricane Agnes, a storm that brought the most rain and wreaked the worst damage in U.S. history up to its time. In the Mid-Atlantic, Agnes remains the storm against which all others will forever be compared. Do you remember where you were? *Bold Forecast--The Hurricane Agnes Deluge*, a new book by Gary Letcher, tells the Agnes story as a compelling narrative, reminding us of the power of Nature – and the power of ordinary people in the face of epic catastrophe.

Agnes raged up from Florida through Virginia, Maryland, and southeastern Pennsylvania, bringing almost every river and stream to its record flood. Dozens of people were killed, thousands of homes and businesses were destroyed, and damages ran into many millions. Yet as powerfully as Agnes punched to the south, she saved her strongest blows for the Susquehanna River basin. Fed by an unforeseen deluge in that river's remote headwaters, the worst of the Agnes floods caught forecasters and riverside communities by surprise in a 400-mile rampage from the Finger Lakes of upstate New York to Maryland's Chesapeake Bay.

Bold Forecast unfolds like a novel. Tales of courage, loss and survival are woven together by the story of scientists who struggled to predict the path of disaster even as their equipment washed away around them. Founded on meticulous research, *Bold Forecast* is the first beginning-to-end telling of this timeless saga of Man vs. Nature. Agnes became a hurricane the very day of the Watergate break-in. Throughout, *Bold Forecast* is set against a backdrop of current events, politics, and popular culture.

Author Gary Letcher was studying geology at the University of Maryland at the time of the Agnes floods. For many years, Letcher practiced environmental law in the Washington DC area and for six years he has taught in UD's OLLI (Osher Life Long Learning - Lewes) where he strives to make class fun and engaging for all participants

His other books include *Waterfalls of the Mid-Atlantic States* (WW Norton, 2005) and *A Paddler's Guide to the Delaware River* (Rutgers Univ. Press, 1985, 1999, 2012).

The Raising of the USS Monitor, February 10, 2023 on Zoom

On March 9, 1862, USS Monitor, prototype of a new class of armored warships, fought the Confederate ironclad CSS Virginia at Hampton Roads, Virginia, only a day after the Virginia had ravaged the Union fleet blockading the James River.

In the world's first clash between iron-armored warships, the Monitor and Virginia exchanged gunfire at close range for nearly four hours. The events at Hampton Roads changed the world's navies. After centuries of dominating battles at sea, wooden, sail-powered warships would be rendered obsolete. Iron, steam power, and heavy guns in rotating turrets were now the means to wage naval warfare. The harbinger of that change did not last long, however. Less than nine months later, the now-famous Monitor was under tow, heading south to Beaufort, North Carolina, when, in heavy seas, the vessel sank, taking sixteen of its crew with it.

On our **ABCW Zoom Social on February 10th**, we look forward to a presentation by John Broadwater, Maritime Archaeologist. Dr. Broadwater was the National Mariners Museum Curator and the Chief Archaeologist on the 2001 USS Monitor Project. We will learn about the successful efforts to recover, conserve, and exhibit key components from the famous Civil War ironclad warship. Additionally, Dr. Broadwater helped to create the Maritime Heritage Program within NOAA's Office of National Marine Sanctuaries. A fascinating story, Dr. Broadwater is author of the book *USS Monitor: A Historic Ship Completes Its Final Voyage*.

Advanced Piloting – Winter 2023

Our boats are on the hard, the holidays will soon be behind us, and you will need to fill your time during the winter months. What better time to enhance your boating skills? You now have the opportunity to take Advanced Piloting (AP) from our acclaimed navigation instructor Randy Williamson with occasional assistance from myself. Classes will be via Zoom on Tuesday evenings from 7 - 9pm, starting on Tuesday, January 31st (no class on Valentine's Day!). Exams will be distributed on April 11th and returned a week later. All sessions will be recorded, so if you can't make one or more of the Tuesday night classes, you can still review any of the classes to keep up during the course.

You should seriously consider taking or auditing Advanced Piloting if:

- You completed the Piloting course in the Spring of 2022.
- It's been more than five years since you took AP – keep your skills fresh!
- You have taken ASA's or USCG's navigation courses but not the USPS Piloting course in the past (I took AP ten years before I challenged the Piloting exam because I had taken several other navigation courses).
- You have completed Piloting ANY time in the past.
 - Did you complete Piloting years ago and think that it's been too long to try to take AP now? Think again! One of our members recently took and passed AP thirty-eight (38!) years after completing the Piloting course. Randy and I are committed to helping anyone refresh their basic charting skills to prepare for AP.

You should have received an email on December 15th with details on the course content, a class schedule and syllabus, instructions on how to register, and the fee(s) for the course and any materials you might need. Please email me at education@abc-wilmington.com ASAP to reserve a "seat" in this class if you are interested. We will be limiting the number of students in this class.

The 2023 ABCW Cruise Committee has laid out the itinerary for our June cruise. It adopted some popular destinations from past cruises. A two-day stop at Oxford this year with some organized or free time is a nod to the two-day stay at St. Michaels that was popular last year. Our team members are actively checking on availability of marinas, catering and dining options.

Note: As this cruise is a little longer (134 nm) than our average cruise distance, the Committee decided to start one day earlier. The Commander's Kick-off at North Point Marina will be on **Friday evening** and boats will depart the next day.

6/10 Rhode River (23nm) – Assigned Raft-ups with a shared menu.

6/11 Herrington Harbor South Marina (13nm) – Dinner on your own. Pavilion breakfast the next morning.

6/12 Hudson Creek, Little Choptank River (22nm) – Assigned Raft-ups with a shared menu.

6/13 Safe Harbor Oxford Marina (20nm) - (formerly Mear's Marina)

6/14 Safe Harbor Oxford Marina (0nm) - Awards banquet at a restaurant in Oxford.

6/15 Dunn Cove, Harris Creek (12nm) - Assigned Raft-ups with a shared menu.

6/16 Mill Creek, Whitehall Bay (30nm) – Assigned Raft-ups with a shared menu or Cantler's.

6/17 Return to Rock Hall (15nm) - End of Cruise

The e-mail requests a reply about tentative interest in joining the 2023 cruise and solicits ideas about what members might want to do and see. Boating Safety News

BUI is just as deadly as drinking and driving!

Did you know?:

- A boat operator is likely to become impaired more quickly than a driver, drink for drink?
- The penalties for BUI can include large fines, revocation of operator privileges and serious jail terms?
- The use of alcohol is involved in about a third of all recreational boating fatalities?

Every boater needs to understand the risks of boating under the influence of alcohol or drugs (BUI). It is illegal to operate a boat while under the influence of alcohol or drugs in every state. The Coast Guard also enforces a federal law that prohibits BUI. This law pertains to ALL boats (from canoes and rowboats to the largest ships) and includes foreign vessels that operate in U.S. waters, as well as U.S. vessels on the high seas.

Tips for Avoiding BUI

Boating, fishing and other water sports are fun in their own right. Alcohol can turn a great day on the water into the tragedy of a lifetime.

Consider these alternatives to using alcohol while afloat:

- Take along a variety of cool drinks, such as sodas, water, iced tea, lemonade or non-alcoholic beer.
- Bring plenty of food and snacks.
- Wear clothes that will help keep you and your passengers cool.
- Plan to limit your trip to a reasonable time to avoid fatigue. Remember that it's common to become tired more quickly on the water.
- If you want to make alcohol part of your day's entertainment, plan to have a party ashore at the dock, in a picnic area, at a boating club, or in your backyard. Choose a location where you'll have time between the fun and getting back into your car or boat.
- If you dock somewhere for lunch or dinner and drink alcohol with your meal, wait a reasonable time (estimated at a minimum of an hour per drink) before operating your boat.
- Having no alcohol while aboard is the safest way to enjoy the water. Intoxicated passengers are also at risk of injury and falls overboard.

Spread the word on the dangers of BUI. Many recreational boaters forget that a boat is a vehicle - and that safe operation is a legal and personal responsibility.
