COMMANDER'S MESSAGE

No purple prose this issue, just business. Some changes are headed our way from the National organization. Some of the biggest changes will be in the Education Department. If you have been reading "The Ensign" lately you will have seen mention of the USPS University concept. What is the USPS University? Briefly it is a combination of expanded course offerings, seminars and a new Boater Certification program. The certification program will qualify boaters at four different levels: Basic, Coastal, Advanced Coastal and Offshore. To reach these levels will require a combination of courses, seminars and skills demonstrations, some of them on the water. USPS is working with boat chatterers', the United States Coast Guard and European government agencies to make this a meaningful program. Presumably this would mean that if you wanted to charter a boat for a week of cruising you would just whip out your certification card and everyone would be happy. Details of the program are still being worked out, but start up is anticipated in the very near future. Watch this space.

You have all heard of the Power of One program. That's where we talk to our boating friends and acquaintances and tell them about all the advantages of USPS and get them to join. One of the dues changes for next year is to increase the one time entrance fee from \$10 to \$25. The new fee will cover an entire family, but if you know an individual who would make a good WPS member do them a favor. Get them to join before the end of May and save them some money.

The final item is a change that hasn't happened yet. At the USPS Annual meeting in February there will be a vote on a proposal to suspend, for three years, the requirement that a prospective member must have passed an approved boating course to qualify for membership. The arguments in favor of this proposal are long (I will supply them on request), but can be summarized by saying that some members consider this to be a hindrance in recruiting new members and, besides, as states tighten their requirements this issue will go away in a few years anyhow. Some of us, including the Wilmington Power Squadron Bridge, believe that it is important to retain this requirement in order to maintain our image as the premier organization for the educated boater. How do you feel? Let us know so that we can represent you adequately.

I have noticed that the closer I get to be your commander next year, the farther I look toward the future. For example, I started this bridge year with the thought that the P/R committee needed to be developed so it might attract new members. When you think about it, those potential members will likely be the future leaders of Wilmington Power Squadron.

Early this year I made a few calls to find out who wanted to help lead the P/R committee. Several members were willing to help out but the leaders needed to be willing to take on a challenge. So it was John Ingram and Harry "Sut" Anderson that agreed to do it and we hammered out our mission statement at our first meeting. From there we established a new website and have had numerous Lubber Line articles reprinted in the Mariner and elsewhere so we can give the general public an understanding of who we are.

A few meetings later, we had created a plan to use fliers and local media resources to help promote the Educational Department's spring boating classes. Sut had researched our poster options, printed up the fliers and attached tear-off boating class information. At our Holiday Social, we got a terrific response from the membership to help us post these fliers from Wilmington and Bear to West Chester and Oxford to Newark and Northeast. All this P/R effort combined should generate a fair amount of excitement for our spring classes!

We always generate new members from the boating classes. During our brainstorming sessions, we have come to understand that the people that take a course are interested in learning enough to be a safe boater, not just fulfill the State's certification requirement. These boaters want to take advantage of the continuing education that we offer and probably want to make friends with like-minded sailors and power boaters. What better way to make friends than get involved? We have lots of

Celebrating the Holidays

Santa welcomed seventy members to the WPS Holiday Social on 3 December 06. We shared a wide array of goodies brought from home and plenty of good company. In support of the Christmas at Sea program of the Wilmington Seaman's Center, members brought a record 45 ditty boxes to share with the lonely seamen who run the ships that bring the treasures of the world to our shores. In addition we displayed some of the dozens of caps, scarves and mittens that we are able to donate to the Center that were the handwork of Tom Webster's sister, Silvia Seer, and of Jean and Harry Anderson's friend, Dorette Richardson. Joan Lyons, Director of the Seaman's Center, was thrilled with our donations when Carl and Mary Stacey delivered them to the Center the next day.

In addition, we were privileged to have a presentation by CPO Roger Krass of the US Coast Guard. He discussed a variety of changes coming to improve the rescue and homeland security capabilities of the Guard in our area. New towers are being installed in the Delaware River and Bay area with RDF capabilities that will enable the Guard to triangulate on emergency transmissions to reduce search time and enhance rescue capabilities. Similar towers will be coming to the Chesapeake in a few years. He reminded us that in 2010 all EPIRB monitoring will be done exclusively on the 406 frequency. All old model EPIRBs using the lower frequency will no longer be functional.

It was a special treat for us to welcome new member, Dotti Brabson, and her husband, Jay, to their

 Advanced Piloting explains navigation with chart plotters, electronic charting systems, radar, sonar and other electronics.
- Advanced positioning techniques with and without electronic are instructed, including avoidance techniques.
- Navigation with tides, winds, and currents are presented, and means to predict their effects and correct for them using electronic and graphical plotting techniques.
